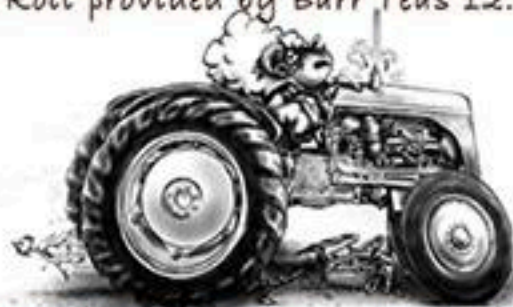


BARR TRAILS DAY

Walk or cycle Changue Forest Trail -
A fairly strenuous (13km) walk towards the old smuggling route of the Nick o' the Balloch with excellent views or take an easy stroll (7.2km) along the Water of Gregg to Kirstie's Cairn. The Devil's Trail (6.5km) climbs steadily from the upper car park, through the woods until beautiful views are revealed of the Stinchar valley. The Fairy Knowe Trail (6km) takes an elevated route looking down the Gregg valley with impressive views from the ridge, but care should be taken on the steep descent down the granite steps.

Gav McDonald designed the ultimate 6hr ride - Start in the beautiful village of Barr and head straight for the Nick O'the Balloch, pay homage to the Highwayman at Rowantree Toll before a sprint up Tairlaw Shalloch and into Straiton. Gav then combines Knockgardner and Glenalla, followed by a climb over Glengennet to Dailly before tackling the Byne and the gorgeous loop to Lendalfoot



On Sunny days one can tell the time by standing in the Laird of Changue's footsteps to cast a shadow on the Community sun dial mosaic opposite the Hall. Barr Trails, landmarks and a wealth of wildlife are celebrated in the artwork, designed and created by village children and volunteers.
